Surf'n'Fries

Surf'n'Fries is a fast-food restaurant chain. Its tasty French fries are offered in all 55 Surf'n'Fries fast-food restaurants in 16 European countries for the reasonable price of €2.50 on average. That doesn't make them either more expensive or cheaper than French fries sold anywhere else. For such a price, you'd expect to get the same French fries there as in any other fast-food restaurant. However, Surf'n'Fries is the only fast-food chain in the world to make their French fries in hot air without any changes to the typical taste of regular French fries which are fried in oil. 'We see a lot of surprised faces,' says Andrija Colak, co-owner of Surf'n'Fries, 'when we tell our customers that our French fries are healthy because we make them without using a drop of oil. This doesn't mean we had to change the shape of our French fries. We decided to keep the favourite U-shape, which had become popular with French fries in other fast food restaurants as the shape is ideal for dipping¹.'

MENHIRLAND CASTLE

a five-star hotel

Menhirland Castle was built in the 16th century. It stands on a hill and the views from it are beautiful. On a bright sunny day, you can see as far as the sea. The closest seashore is amazing and it only takes half an hour to get there. Menhirland Castle is not the only castle in the area, but it is the only one which serves as a hotel.

HOTEL → After serving as a family home for four centuries, the castle was sold to Irish businessman Bernard O'Brien in 1962. Two years later, the castle opened as a five-star hotel to its first guests. Since then it has been the most popular hotel in the area. After Mr O'Brien died in 1980, his family sold the castle to another Irish family. Although the owners are often offered a lot of money for it, they refuse to sell it. They almost lost the castle twice. In 1985, some damage was done to the castle when it was flooded during a summer storm. In 2006, a huge thunderstorm hit the area. During the thunderstorm, Menhirland Castle was struck by lightning and so were some trees near the castle. Two of them actually caught fire and burned to the ground. They were so close to Menhirland Castle that everyone was surprised that it survived without any damage.

STAYING IN MENHIRLAND CASTLE

The interior of the castle has been reconstructed. There are twenty deluxe rooms, two suites¹, a conference hall, a romantic restaurant and a wellness centre in the hotel now. The owners even wanted to install lifts there, but historians protested. They wanted only stairs between the floors. After long discussions about the lift, in the end the owners were allowed to install one, which they did.

Menhirland Castle is surrounded by a large park which is open to the guests all day. The grass is cut regularly and the castle park might look like a golf course from a distance. However, guests have to drive to a golf club in a nearby town to play golf.

Over the years, many famous people have stayed at Menhirland Castle. For example, in 2015 famous actress Saoirse McDonough married popular politician Harry Simons there. The groom had spent the night at the castle the previous year and loved it so much that he decided to marry Saoirse McDonough there. It was the event of the year.

MENHIRLAND CASTLE SUITES

Queen Anne Suite – a beautiful double room which is perfect for couples or a family of three. The suite is €1,200 per night for two, and €1,400 for three. The suite needed some changes in the past. The first changes took place in 1985. In the spring of that year, all the walls were painted and new carpets were put in. Unfortunately, the changes to the whole suite had to be done again in late summer that year because of the floods. Since then the suite hasn't needed any changes. The Queen Anne Suite is popular because its windows face the castle park.

King John Suite – this luxurious suite for two for is €1,400 per night. Please note that no extra guests are allowed in the suite. The suite's decoration hasn't changed since 1995 when the suite was renovated² for the second time in its history. The first renovation took place in the spring of 1985. Fortunately the floods in the summer of that year didn't reach the suite so the renovation didn't have to be repeated. King John Suite is popular with newly-wed couples. This is because none of them can wait to have their wedding photo taken on its balcony with the castle park behind them.

From Street Child to Top Photographer

When I was 14, I spent most of my time on the streets of Rio de Janeiro. My father, who worked as a driver, had left our family so I had to help my mother. She has sold goods at the market all her life. As a child, I spent time with her at the market, but I still had some spare time to play football with my friends. They all dreamt of becoming famous footballers and giving interviews to journalists after winning a match. I didn't. I wanted to do the interviews rather than give them – but not with famous footballers, I wanted to write articles about life on the streets. I wanted people to read in newspapers about how street kids, poor drivers and sellers live. I just refused to end up driving around like my dad, or doing my mum's job, although she expected me to.

As my mother couldn't really afford to pay for my education, I taught myself – I read books and learnt English. Then one day when I was 18, a friend of mine offered to sell me a camera. He got it as a Christmas present from a family he worked for, but he had no idea how to use it. So he thought he would sell it to me. I had no money but I had a mobile phone, which my mother bought for me from a tourist. So I gave it to my friend and received his camera for it. When my mum asked about the camera, I said that I had found it at the city market but lost the mobile phone there. To this day, I regret lying to her.

I started taking photos of things around me with my new camera – not people, just things. Then I developed¹ the photos in the darkroom in my best friend's house. I still remember the time I developed my first photos. My own face in one of them surprised me. I must have taken that photo when I was checking the camera and pushed the button by mistake. Seeing the photo, I realised I could take photos of other people, too. So I took a lovely photo of my mum. Later, when my brother came home that day with his best friend, I took a photo of each of them as well: first my brother, then his best friend. My own best friend didn't want to be photographed, but often helped me develop photos.

Then one day, when I was 20, I was accepted to the Vancouver Institute of Photography. I couldn't wait to go, but unfortunately getting to Vancouver seemed like an <u>unfeasible</u> thing because there were too many difficult things to do before leaving. Getting a visa, for example, was so hard that I almost gave up and stayed at home. But I really wanted to go, so giving up was not acceptable to me. So I kept trying. I knew I had to manage all the difficult things, and I did, but these times were exhausting. I didn't expect such difficulties. However, if I had to experience it again to get to Vancouver, I would. It was absolutely worth it.

Since then fifteen years have passed and now I am a well-known artist. I don't have much time for friends as I'm very busy, either opening photo exhibitions or taking photos. Next week, for example, I'm going to Lisbon. My friend Fernando, a photographer, lives there. We haven't seen each other since last year's street festival in Lisbon. Back then we were both in the streets ready with our cameras but as it was raining a lot we didn't take many good photos. If it rains again this time, I'll be really disappointed. The street festival is famous and I can't wait to go. If Fernando knew I was coming to Lisbon, he would ask me to open his new photo exhibition. But I didn't tell him I would be in Lisbon because his exhibition opens on the day the street festival begins and I don't want to miss a single minute of that. A magazine with which I had signed a contract to photograph the street festival will be waiting for the photos.

Apart from next weekend, the area is open every day so you are welcome to visit.

Queen Mary Recreation Area

The area is best known for paths Queen Mary used when hiking there. The area is a 37-mile drive from Gowden and only a 27-mile drive from Stathmore. The area is open on Saturdays and Sundays only. The area is biker friendly and it is possible to hire bikes there. There is no other rental service there. The car park is at the gate to the area. No fee is charged for parking your car there.

Mollytore Recreation Area

The recreation area is especially popular with visitors from Gowden, a town which is a 29-mile drive away. It is open every day and the easiest way to get there from Gowden is by car. You can park in the car park in front of the entrance to the recreation area for £5 a day. You can also hire bikes there. Renting inline skates used to be possible, but not anymore. Feel free to bring your own.

The area is open every day except for next weekend when it is closed for a private event. If you come by car, you don't have to worry about a parking fee, as parking at the car park there is free. The area is only a 25-mile drive from Gowden, and 25 more miles away from Tadger. The area offers bikes for hire right at the entry gate. This is the only rental service provided by the recreation area.

Would you like to enjoy some fresh air at the weekend or on a weekday? Then come to Martdoor recreation area, 32 miles south of Gowden by car. If you don't feel like hiking, you can rent both bikes and inline skates there. There's a car park at the entrance to the area and you can leave your car there if you don't mind paying. Leaving your car anywhere else near the area is not allowed.

Just a 28-mile drive from Gowden, it is the only private recreation area in the region. Visitors aren't charged any fees to park their car at the car park right at the entrance. The area is open only at weekends, weekdays are for private events. Attention! The place where visitors could hire a bike for a small fee is now closed. But instead, for £6 a day you can rent inline skates at the entrance.
